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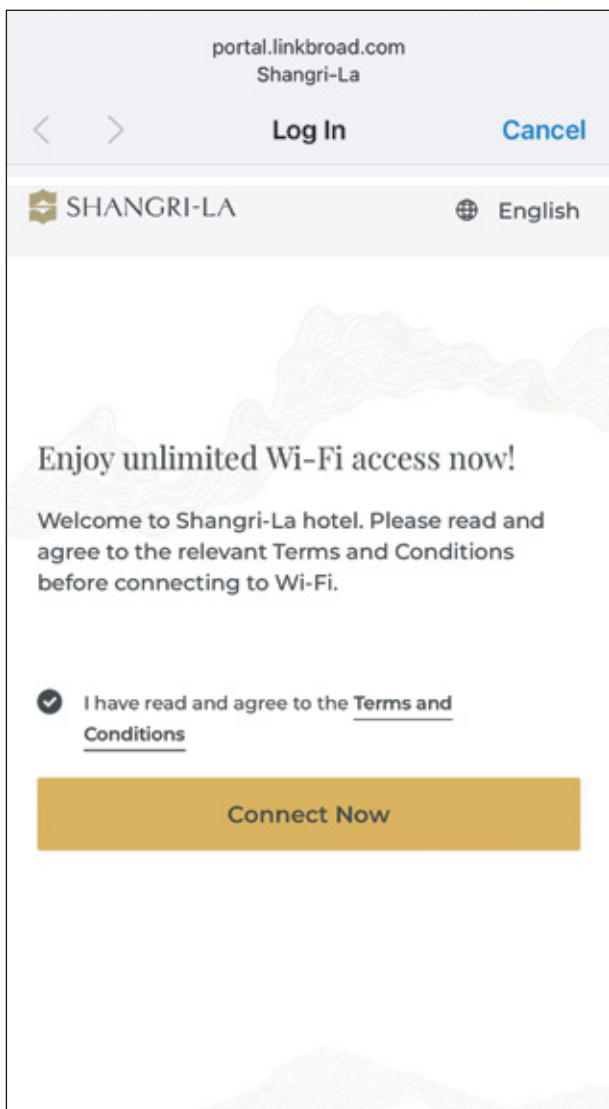
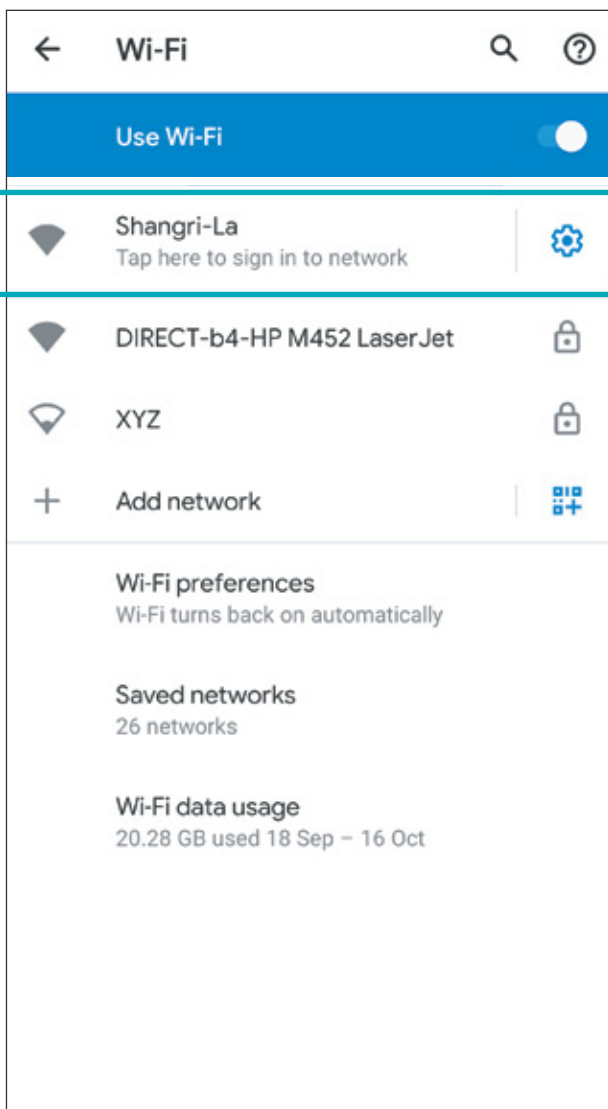
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Welcome to Shangri-La Bangkok.

- **Wi-Fi** is available free of charge in all guestrooms and public area - no password required.

are 5 minutes' walking distance from the Shangri-La Wing. The shuttle van to service to BTS SkyTrain Station and Sathorn Pier departs every hour from 9am to 6pm.

- **In-Room Locker/Safe Deposit**

For your convenience, an in-room locker is placed in the closet of your guestroom. Additional safe deposit boxes are available at the reception desk in the lobby, 24 hours a day. The hotel will not be responsible for any loss or damage of valuables from your room or public areas.

- **Deposit for Room and Incidental Charges**

Shangri-La Bangkok requires a deposit from every guest upon check-in.

Room charges pre-paid by a third party or by the guest:

50% of room rates inclusive of applicable taxes and service charge.

Room charge unpaid:

150% of room rates inclusive of applicable taxes and service charge.

You may pay by either credit card or cash in Thai baht.

Please be informed that this is only a block, and not a charge. We will use this deposit at the time of check-out to settle your bill. Any excess amount left from your deposit will be credited back to your card within 10-14 working days.

- **Laundry**

Professional laundry, dry cleaning and pressing services are available in the hotel. Laundry collected before 12 noon will be returned on the same day. An express service is available with additional charge. Laundry lists and bags are available inside the guestroom closet.

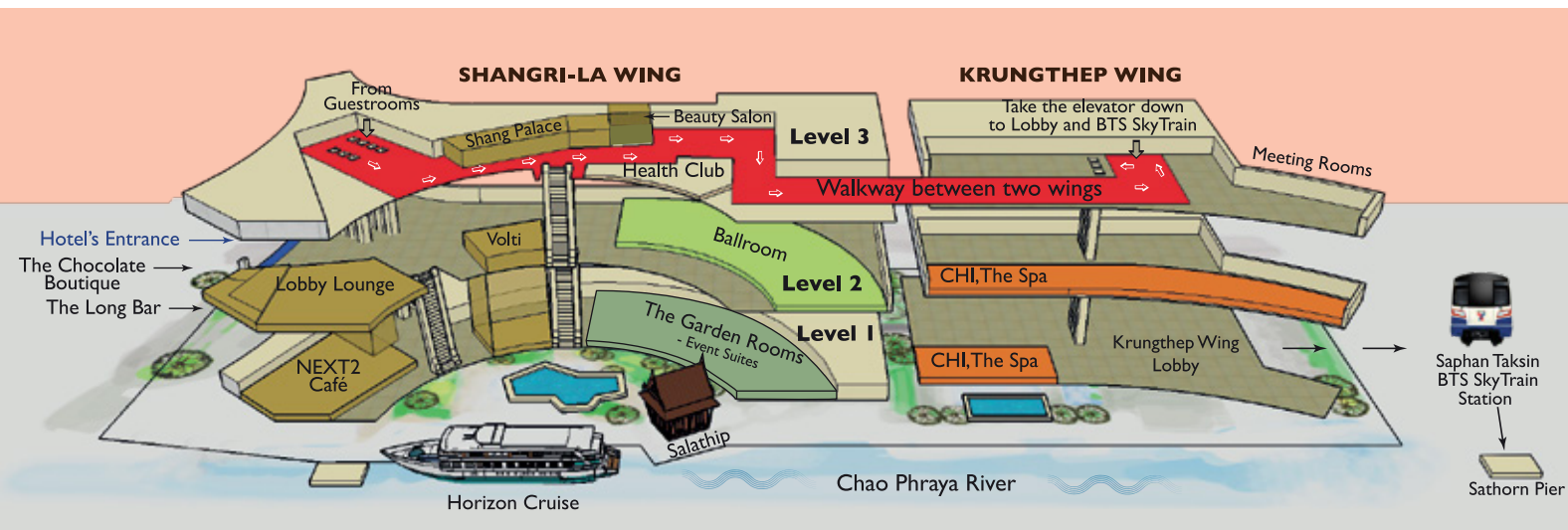

Shangri-La Bangkok is located in Bang Rak which literally means “Village of Love”. Due to its name, the district has become a popular place to register marriages, especially on Valentine’s Day.

The hotel is also situated on one of the oldest roads in the country, Charoen Krung, once a canal before being paved in 1862, during the reign of King Rama IV.

Bang Rak has become a hip area of late where a wave of new galleries, bar and restaurants opening up, adding more character and vitality to the district. A fun quest to do on a hot summer day is to gather your friends for some café hopping and street-art hunting, starting from our Krungthep Wing wall at Sathorn Pier where you will find the massive quirky mural of Dutch artist Daan Botlek, which was part of the 2016 BUKRUK Urban Arts Festival. A street map of art locations can be downloaded from Bukruk.com.

Another interesting space is the Thailand Creative & Design Center (TCDC) located within part of the historic Grand Postal Building, a 9,000-metre spread comprising a well-praised design library, silent study area, exhibition space, design shop, coworking space, workshop room and a material and design renovation center.

Bang Rak is much more than meets the eye, and you can spend days exploring the neighbourhood by foot, tuk tuk or boat, witnessing the local lifestyle.



Ride the SkyTrain



Travel in Bangkok could not be simpler with the SkyTrain. With the Saphan Taksin BTS station at the hotel's doorstep, you can hop into your favourite mall and hop out back to the urban retreat of Shangri-La in no time.



Shop at Chatuchak Weekend Market



With over 8,000 stalls covering 27 acres of space, this is one of the largest markets in the world. Open every Saturday and Sunday, it attracts nearly 200,000 visitors a day. You will find everything you could ever imagine for sale here and mostly at a good deal.



Take a boat trip along the Chao Phraya River



The Chao Phraya River is the lifeblood of Bangkok. Even today, 50,000 people still go to work on one of the many ferries that go up and down its water. Taking a boat trip down the river is fascinating as you will see the contrast between high-rise condominiums and luxury hotels on one side and the lifestyle of the locals living on the banks of the river on the other side.



Take a stroll through Lumpini Park



Escape from the concrete jungle to the 500,000-square-metre Lumpini Park in the city centre of Bangkok. You will find people taking part in all sorts of activities - Jogging, walking or even practising tai chi. The best time to visit is early morning or just before sunset.

Asiatique The Riverfront



Asiatique has successfully combined two of the most popular shopping experiences in the city: a night bazaar and a mall. This once-bustling international trade port has been transformed, with over 1,500 boutiques and 40 restaurants housed under a huge replica warehouse complex. Have fun browsing the boutiques or picking up gifts. Calypso ladyboy cabaret is performed nightly.

MBK Shopping Centre



One of the most crowded and popular shopping centres among local people and tourists alike is the MBK Center (initials of Mah Boon Krong Centre). Seven stories high and 330 metres long, with more than 2,500 shops spanning over 89,000 square metres, this shopping mall was once the biggest mall in Asia when it was founded in 1985. It is particularly well known for its variety of products and vendors, including electronics, fashion items, mobile phones, souvenirs as well as furniture. A covered, air-conditioned skybridge over Phaya Thai Road connects to a congested sister shopping centre, the Bonanza Mall.

Transportation : Take a taxi or the BTS SkyTrain - National Stadium Station



Jim Thompson House



Thai silk is famous the world over and nowhere will you find a better place to learn about the history behind the craft than at the Jim Thompson House. As you walk around the house you will not only learn the history of the Thai Silk Company, but also the fascinating history of Jim Thompson himself.

Admission: THB 200; THB 100 for visitors under 22 years old; free for children under 10 when accompanied by an adult

Transportation: Take a taxi or the BTS SkyTrain – National Stadium Station.



Siam Paragon Shopping Mall

Located in the heart of Bangkok, Siam Paragon is the first mega shopping complex in Thailand, offering a magnificent and elegant shopping experience as it houses various world-class international brands and flagship stores of the most prestigious high-end brands; truly a shopping paradise for brand name lovers.

Transportation: Take a taxi or the BTS SkyTrain - Siam Station



Erawan Shrine (Four-Faced Buddha)



The most popular shrine of all is the Erawan Shrine, or San Phra Phrom in Thai. It stands gracefully at the Ratchaprasong intersection of Ratchadamri Road. The Erawan Shrine is a four-faced statue of Brahma, who is part of the trinity of Hinduism's most revered gods. It attracts thousands of worshippers from all over the world who come to pray for good fortune and the fulfilment of their dreams and desires. The shrine is often engulfed in a haze of burning incense and the scent of fragrant garlands.

Admission is free

Transportation: Take a taxi or the BTS SkyTrain - Ratchadamri Station

A large shopping mall and office complex in Bangkok owned by the Central Group. In 2006, after three years of design and renovation, the expanded 550,000-square-metre mall was opened, topping its nearby rival Siam Paragon in terms of design and size. The mall is the largest shopping centre in South East Asia and it is larger than Hong Kong's Ocean Terminal. This shopping centre also houses Thailand Knowledge Park (TK Park) – a complex that includes a library, internet centre, a 4D movie theatre and other media facilities. TK Park is owned and operated by the government of Thailand.

Transportation: Take a taxi or the BTS SkyTrain – Chit Lom Station

Wat Pho

It is the home to the Reclining Buddha which stands at 15 metres tall and 46 metres long; the feet alone are measured at over 5 metres. Wat Pho is regarded as Thailand's first university where the traditions of Thai medicine and massage are preserved and taught to future generations.

Admission: THB 200 for foreigners
Transportation: Take the Chao Phraya express boat – Tha Tien Pier.



Grand Palace and the Temple of the Emerald Buddha

Visiting the Grand Palace is indeed a great way to become immersed in Thai culture. Built in the year Bangkok was founded, the splendid Grand Palace, with its rich cultural heritage, spans over 218,400 square metres. With the Temple of the Emerald Buddha in the same compound, this dazzling complex is the absolute landmark of not just Bangkok but Thailand itself. It is certainly a must see for all visitors.

Admission fee: THB 500
Transportation: Take a taxi, or a Chao Phraya express boat – Chang Pier
Clothing: Dress properly – a shirt with sleeves, long pants or a skirt covering the knees



The Bangkok National Museum

The Bangkok National Museum is home to the largest collection of artefacts and Thai art in all of Thailand. The museum was founded by King Rama V to display his father King Rama IV's private collection of antiquities. It is within walking distance of Wat Phra Kaew and the Grand Palace, so you can easily combine a day trip to these spots while in Bangkok.

Admission: THB 200 for foreigners
Transportation: Take a taxi, or a Chao Phraya express boat - Chang Pier



Wat Arun



Situated on the bank of the Chao Phraya River is the beautiful temple that stands 79 metres tall and was named after Aruna, the god of dawn. The tower is covered in ceramic tiles and coloured porcelain, making for an incredible sight when you catch it in the right light.

Admission: THB 50 for foreigners
Transportation: Take the Chao Phraya express boat – Tha Tien Pier, and then take a ferry to the opposite side.

Safety and Security

SAFETY

Please read the following information to ensure your maximum safety.

In the unlikely event of an emergency, this information serves as life-saving advice.

The emergency exits are clearly marked and lit on every floor. The fire escape and emergency exit plan is mounted behind the guestroom door. Familiarise your location and the neighboring escape routes.

An emergency torchlight is available near your bedside cabinet. Should you have any questions, please contact our Guest Service Centre.

In case of heavy smoke, you may encounter difficulties in locating these emergency exits, so please take the time to take note of the following areas:

- Count the number of doors between your guestroom door and emergency exits, you will find the closest emergency exit.
- Observe the location of the fire extinguisher/hoses and manual push button/break glass alarm along the corridor

If you detect a fire:

- Activate the nearest manual push button/break glass alarm.
- Contact the Guest Service Centre.
- Leave the building by using the nearest emergency exit staircase and do not use the elevator. Please take your guestroom key card with you.
- Close door(s) if unable to leave your guestroom and place wet towels around door gaps.
- In case of small fire, you may try to extinguish it and report your action to the Emergency Centre at extension 1919 or 0.

If evacuation is required:

- Take your guestroom key, stay calm and proceed to the guestroom door.
- Feel the door handle, do not open the door if the handle is hot, it means fire is at the back of the door. If not, open it carefully, but be ready to close it immediately.
- If there is smoke in the corridor, stay low and keep a wet cloth over your nose and mouth.
- Proceed to the nearest emergency exit. Stay calm and always hold the handrail when using the staircase.
- If the nearest exit is blocked, return to your guestroom or to the rooftop or to the ground level and wait for rescue.
- Never attempt to use the elevator in case of fire.
- Please gather at the main entrance as the fire-evacuation point after evacuating from hotel building.

For disabled guests who require assistance:

- Advise the hotel reception personnel upon check-in of your disability or as soon as possible thereafter.
- In case of emergency, call the Guest Service Centre or activate the manual alarm button for assistance immediately.

If you must stay in your room:

- Do not panic.
- Turn off the air-conditioning.
- Fill the bath-tub with water, soak towels and linens.
- Contact the Guest Service Centre and indicate your location.
- Place wet towels and sheets around door gaps and air vents.
- If smoke still enters your guestroom, keep a wet cloth over your nose and mouth.

If a fire starts in your room:

- Take your room key and evacuate the guestroom immediately.
- Close the door securely behind you.
- Activate the manual push button/break glass alarm and notify your immediate neighbours.
- Call the Guest Service Centre at the nearest telephone to report the fire. Walk to safety via the emergency exit to the fire evacuation points at the hotel main entrance.
- Do not use the elevator.

SECURITY

Information and Assistance

Our desire is to make your visit enjoyable and free from any unpleasant incidents. The hotel is patrolled regularly by our security personnel. If you notice any suspicious activity or you are in need of any assistance, please contact the Guest Service Centre and ask for the Duty Manager.

Guestroom Key

It is not necessary to deposit your guestroom key at the reception desk each time you leave the hotel. However, please return the key to the reception desk upon check-out.

Door Locks

Our rooms are fitted with an additional security chain or door latch. This chain or latch is activated from inside of your room. It is recommended that you use this feature whenever you are inside your room, especially upon retiring.

Observation Port

Your guestroom door is equipped with an observation port which permits you to see the corridor outside your guestroom without opening the door. Before opening your door, please use the observation port to determine who is seeking entry. Your cooperation is sought in ensuring that you only open your door for Shangri-la Hotel staff that can be identified by their uniforms, name tags and identification cards. If you are in doubt of anyone's identity, call the Guest Service Centre and ask for the Duty Manager.

Room Number

To ensure privacy, hotel personnel are instructed not to give out guestroom numbers of registered guests. You may be connected directly to the guest's room by giving the name of the guest to the Guest Service Centre. If you don't want to be disturbed, please tell the Service Centre staff to put you as Confidential Stay.

Valuables

An electronic locker is available in your guestroom for non-valuable items. Do not use simple numbers like '123456' for the locker combination. For your valuables, safe deposit boxes are provided free of charge at the Front Desk. We regret to inform you that the hotel cannot be held responsible for valuables kept in the guestroom.

Visitors To Your Room

According to local laws, all visitors are requested to leave the guestroom by 9pm. Please register overnight visitors you may have at the Front Desk.

2. ติดตามและประเมินผลกระทบต่อสิ่งแวดล้อมจากการดำเนินงานอย่างต่อเนื่อง และสนับสนุนให้เกิดการแก้ไขปัญหาและผลกระทบนั้นๆ
3. ลดปริมาณขยะหรือของเสียโดยการประเมินจากผลการดำเนินงาน รวมทั้งสนับสนุนให้พนักงาน แขก และผู้ทำธุรกิจร่วมให้ความสำคัญกับการรีไซเคิล
4. มีการใช้น้ำ และพลังงานอย่างเหมาะสม โดยการนำขั้นตอนการปฏิบัติที่เป็นนวัตกรรมใหม่มาประยุกต์ใช้เพื่อให้เกิดประโยชน์สูงสุด

7. มีการฝึกอบรมให้กับพนักงานและบุคคลที่เกี่ยวข้องในเรื่องของการรักษาสิ่งแวดล้อม สุขภาพ และความปลอดภัย
8. มีการควบคุมความปลอดภัยในการทำงาน รวมถึงการจัดเตรียมขั้นตอนเพื่อรองรับกรณีมีเหตุฉุกเฉิน
